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Thank you

Your support means a lot — by even considering getting involved, you're already part of a community that's making a real difference.

Syria has entered a new chapter after decades of authoritarian rule
— one of hope and uncertainty. A broken economy, lack of basic
services and rising violence are just some of the daily challenges that
Syrians are facing.

Action Syria (previously the Hands Up Foundation) is working with local partners to create lasting impact where needs are greatest. Now is the time to step up and take stronger action to ensure Syrians have the medical care and education they need as they rebuild.

We all have the power to help, and it doesn't have to be difficult!

To amplify the impact of Action Syria Carols (previously Singing for Syrians), we're asking you to hold your own fundraiser this festive season. Whether it's music-themed — like a concert or singalong with friends — or something different, like a Christmas crafts session, you'll be turning celebration into a powerful force for good.

What you'll be supporting

For the last 11 years, Action Syria has supported sustainable projects led by Syrians, both inside Syria and in neighbouring countries.

Given the new context since the fall of Assad, and the hope and uncertainty that has come with the interim government, we reviewed the situation in Syria and how we can continue to make an impact. Our focus remains on working with local partners to make sure Syrian communities have the medical care and education they need, every day and when emergencies strike.

We scoped new partners, identified where support is needed most, and launched two new partnerships with Syrian-led organisations, MARS and Abjad, in July 2025. We've also continued working with long-standing partners such as SAWA. Our partnerships reflect our commitment to adapt to where the needs are greatest and support local organisations who know their communities best.

Action Syria is proud to currently be supporting:

School in Lebanon's Bekaa Valley — in partnership with SAWA

Delivering full-time education for 80 Syrian refugee children, including psychosocial support, safe transport, and heating in winter. Action Syria funds the full operating costs, including teacher and support staff salaries.





School rehabilitation in Zamalka

— in partnership with Abjad

Restoring a public school to provide safe access to education for over 750 children in rural Damascus. The project includes upgrades to water, sanitation, power, and accessibility — including improved access for children with disabilities.

Classroom restoration in Daraya — in partnership with MARS

Renovating four classrooms, including one model space to set a new standard for safe, inclusive learning. Action Syria's funding delivers engaging learning spaces for 200 children.

At Action Syria, health has been at the core of our mission since the beginning. We've delivered medical support such as prosthetics and primary healthcare to underserved areas, and acted fast to address urgent health needs. We're ready to keep going and strengthen our support, but we don't have the funding to do it.

During this critical time for Syria, your fundraising initiative can support safe and inclusive learning for Syrian children, and restart life-saving medical care for communities where access is limited.

Event ideas

We've got some ideas to get you started, but feel free to get as creative as you like with your fundraiser in aid of Action Syria.

Carol service collection

Why not combine forces with an existing event? Tie in a donation collection with your school, university, or community's carol service this year — it's a super simple way to get involved.

Or, if you're part of a choir and want to do something bigger, you could put together a concert in your local village hall and perform for friends and family.

Christmas jumper day

Encourage your pupils to donate a couple of pounds to come to school in a fun and colourful Christmas jumper. You could even link this to an assembly on Syria — we'd be happy to provide resources to support.

Crafts session

Get your friends together and host a Christmas crafts session. From knitting scarfs to making wreaths to decorating gingerbread — you can get creative and make a difference!

Winter bake sale

Whip up your favourite festive bakes, and share them with your local community at a bake sale.

Festive drinks

Get your local community together for some mulled wine, hot chocolate or mince pies. It's a great way to get to know your neighbours better or have a catch up with friends, all while spreading festive cheer!

Simple steps to holding your event



1. **Mark your calendars** — Choose a date, time and venue.



2. **Get planning** — Gather friends, neighbours, colleagues, or family to help plan the event. Share tasks and keep a track of what everyone has volunteered to do. Sharing the load will make it easier and much more fun.



3. **Begin to spread the word** — The more people that attend, the more you can raise. Encourage your friends and family to post on social media, and we'll shout about it too!



4. **Set a target** — This will help to encourage donations. And there are always ways to make more: hand round a bucket for donations at the end of your event, and explain to guests where their money is going.



5. **Be prepared on the day** — Make sure you're fully equipped with resources and information to share with people about the impact of their support — we've included some at the end of this pack.

Your guide to hosting an Action Syria Carols event

Where you can host the event

Pretty much anywhere works!

- Village hall or school
- Local church, mosque, temple, or gurdwara
- A bigger concert venue
- Even your own living room

Tip: Already got a carol concert or festive get-together planned? Turn it into a fundraiser!

How to spread the word about Syria during the event

The personal touch matters.

- Tell your guests why you're inspired to support Action Syria it's your story that connects.
- Don't worry about being an expert!
- You could invite someone who knows more to say a few words
 think journalists, writers, artists, or students.

How to promote the event

- Ask friends to invite their own circles family, colleagues, community groups.
- Use social media (Instagram, WhatsApp, Facebook groups) to share your event widely. Get friends to share too!
- Don't forget to tag us: <u>@actionsyriauk</u> on Instagram, <u>Action</u> Syria on Facebook.
- Old school more your style? Send a note to your local newspaper.

How you can maximise the impact

You're already doing something amazing by supporting Action Syria. If you'd like to go one step further, why not team up with local businesses?

- Ask for sponsorship They could chip in with money, or cover costs like food, drinks, or prizes.
- Look for community champions Lots of supermarkets have dedicated staff who can donate items or vouchers for local causes.
- Make it a win-win Remind them it's great for their ESG credentials, and offer to pop their logo on your posters or event page — it gives them visibility too.

A little local support can go a long way in making your fundraiser even more fun and successful!

Fundraising tips

Whether you're hosting festive drinks, a carol service or something different, here are some simple ways to make your fundraiser shine:

- **Set up a fundraising page** The easiest way to collect donations is online (via <u>our webpage</u> or JustGiving).
- Offer options Not everyone likes online giving, so let people know they can donate by BACS or cheque too. Don't forget to encourage Gift Aid it adds 25% at no cost to them.
- Add a personal touch Share a bit about yourself and why you're fundraising. A photo makes it feel more real and inspiring.
- Explain the cause Be clear about what you're doing, why you're raising money, and always say it's "in aid of Action Syria."
- **Be upfront** If any of the money will cover expenses (like food or materials), let supporters know.
- **Spread the word** Share your page on social media (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, X) and tag us so we can cheer you on!
- **Keep people updated** Post little updates as you go planning, menus, rehearsal snaps, progress towards your target.
- **Say thanks** A quick thank you goes a long way in keeping donors connected.

One last thing: fundraising for charities like Action Syria is regulated by the Fundraising Regulator. By following these tips, you'll be keeping everything safe, legal and transparent.

Education | Health | Emergencies







What we do

We work with local partners to make sure Syrian communities have the medical care and education they need, every day and when emergencies strike.

At same time, we offer you a way to help and we make sure our funding gets to the right people quickly and safely.

Who we help

Over the past year (2024-25) we helped over 20,000 Syrians, funding:



Over 17,600 medical consultations



Education for 84 children



Salaries for 10 medical staff, 6 education staff, and 43 support staff



Two playgrounds for 2,400 children



61 prosthetics and 193 orthotic devices



Emergency supplies and hot meals for 240 families

Right now, we're providing education to over 80 Syrian refugee children and rehabilitating schools in rural Damascus. We're raising funds to sustain these programmes, as well as restart our prosthetics clinic and primary health centre in northern Syria. We also mobilise when there is an emergency, such as an earthquake.









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
